What is the hazard?	Crates falling down and hitting those on ground
Who is at risk?	Participants and instructor

Current control measures	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Ensure towers are built with short axis of crate facing belay teams - this means crates fall away from belay team.• Those not directly taking part in the activity are to be kept out of the way, eg sitting on bench.• Everyone wearing a helmet• Limit height of tower to 20 crates high.

What other measures are necessary?	None
What monitoring is needed?	Sessions checked for safety. Monitor near-miss and accident register.
